In 2015, 100% of MAT candidates seeking teaching positions for the 2014-2015 academic year received full-time teaching offers following graduation. Of the 30 program completers, 28 taught in classroom settings, with one coaching at the university level and one working with City Year.

Teacher Supply and Demand in Texas

Demand for teachers in Texas is expected to remain strong through 2016. High need areas include the following teaching fields:

- Bilingual/English as a Second Language
- Career and Technical Education
- Computer Science
- English as a Second Language Mathematics
- Science
- Special Education – Elementary and Secondary Levels

That said, the demand for teaching positions along the I-35 corridor is typically lower than in other areas of the state. Candidates are encouraged to broaden job searches whenever possible to identify the most teaching vacancies.
